- This incident occurred within the Lakeland area
- Immediate Law Enforcement attendance is not required
- This is NOT an emergency.

You can report numerous incidents such as lost property, mischief, property damage, theft under \$5000, and suspicious activity.

## **If we needed to contact you – do we have your information?**

We rely on the information that you provide to the District of Lakeland to contact you in an emergency. If a disaster strikes your property, a tree falls on your roof, your doors are open, or you have been victim to some vandalism - is your contact information readily available? You can contact the District of Lakeland at 306-982-2010 to ensure that we have the correct, most up to date information to contact you if needed. This information is kept private as is all your property tax information.

LDPS has deployed staff to do late night/early morning high visibility patrols. These patrols are scheduled randomly, through the week between the hours of 10 PM and 6 AM. Five of these patrols have taken place since mid September, and will continue for most of the winter.

These patrols are being done as a result of public consultation and feedback from the community. With the support of Council, we have increased staffing in order to be in the Lakeland area more during fall and winter. Our goals are to deter unwanted activity. During these patrols we will be doing increased traffic enforcement and making a specific effort to be patrolling through the many subdivisions. Some of these patrols will take place with other law enforcement, including RCMP and Conservation Officers.

## **Snowmobile Operation**

With snow soon to be covering our landscape, we want to remind riders that law enforcement will be out on the trails again this year. Please also remember:

- Register your machine. Your registration dollars help to fund the province's snowmobile trail system, including supporting your local Lakeland Snowmobile Club.
- Sledding and drinking/drugs don't mix! Penalties are the same for operation of your sled as it is for a vehicle on the highway. Save the celebrations until after your ride.
- Operation of your snow machine is only permitted on designated trails. You need permission to be on private property.



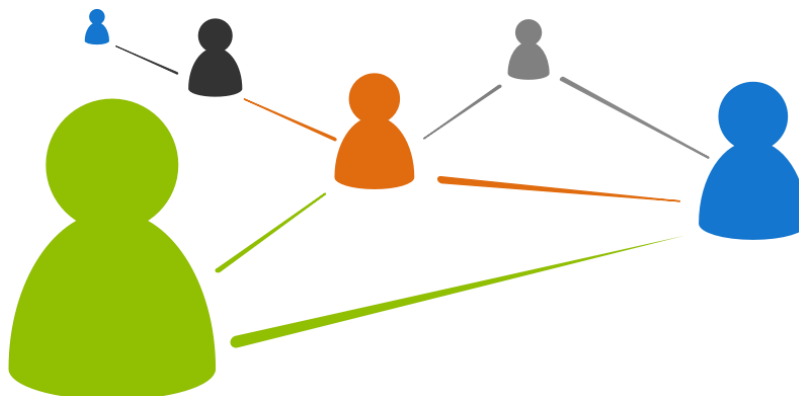
Bears will be hibernating very soon. Calls regarding bears and garbage can be reduced significantly by the public using the bear proof garbage containers provided by the municipality.

## **Community Safety and Crime Prevention**

Getting to know your neighbours will make it easier to spot suspicious activity – a stranger at your door, window or backyard; an unusual car in the driveway; and any kind of unusual activity that could be cause for concern.

Here are a few tips to keep in mind from [Canada Safety Council](#):

- Outfit your doors with good, sturdy locks, making sure to keep them locked at all times and especially when your home is unoccupied. A secure and sturdy lock will make break-ins more difficult.
- Who is checking your place while you're gone for the winter? For many of you, the Lakeland area is your seasonal destination for rest, relaxation and fun! We encourage you to have your place checked on regularly to ensure that your place is secure, and hasn't been victim to a crime.
- Do not use this as an opportunity to be a busybody or a vigilante. Keeping an eye on your neighbourhood does not mean spying on your neighbours, taking the law into your own hands or attempting to apprehend or detain a suspect yourself.
  - **Remember to report a crime in progress to 911, not your Facebook page.**
- Do be prepared to act. Use your judgment in reporting suspicious activity to the non-emergency line 24-hour line, 306-982-4466. Call 911 for any emergency or crime in progress. These usually include burglary, assault, fire, gunshots, a person with a weapon, robbery, and serious injury or an obviously suspicious person or vehicle.



- Do your part to keep your community safe. A group acting together in the same interest is much stronger than an individual. Keep an eye out for your neighbours and they'll do the same for you!

As we move into winter Public works will be clearing snow off of roadways. Please ensure your garbage containers are removed from the roadways no later then 7:00 PM the day of garbage collection.

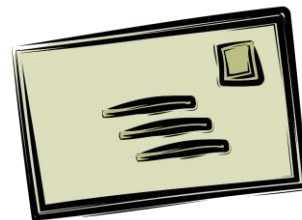
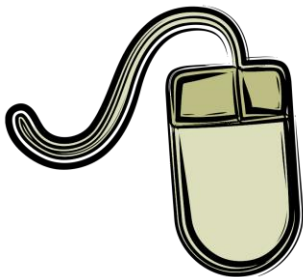
