Emergency or crime-in-progress? Call 911!

For incidents occurring within the Lakeland area, Lakeland District Protective Services (LDPS) offers online reporting in addition to having our calls answered 24 hour a day by the Provincial Emergency Communications Center. **Our dispatch is 982-4466.** Report stolen property, mischief, damages, and other non-emergency incidents.

We have adjusted our service, using PPE such as masks, to continue to serve you.

Although reporting on suspected COVID-19 violations may be reported to LDPS or the RCMP it is encouraged that you report directly to the [province online](#) or call their non-medical COVID response line at **1-855-559-5502**

Please note that when calling our office to report a matter we require you to provide your information to the dispatcher. Anonymous calls, or calls where the caller refuses to leave call back information, including telephone number or name, will not be responded to.



For those who come visit Lakeland this summer, we ask that you please park appropriately. Park on or within your property when possible. Parking in prohibited areas or parking illegally may result in your vehicle being towed, and a ticket issued.

Bears

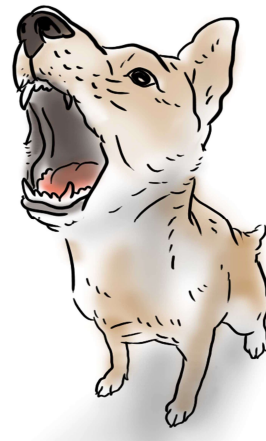
Early reports from Ministry of Environment (MOE) indicate that there will likely be a healthy bear population again in 2020. In order for you to help reduce the likelihood of interaction with wildlife, including bears, there are a number of steps you can take:

- Keep your property free of any possible food source such as grease on bbqs, bird feeders, and waste including soiled food containers.
- Store your waste indoors or in a shed until garbage pickup day.
- Try using the bear proof waste bins if you cannot store your own bin indoors.
- During the spring and fall when bears are particularly active, use the bins as much as possible.

Should a bear continue to linger in a populated area or continue to return you can report it several ways. You can call the Ministry of Environment TIPP line at 1-800-667-7561 or by calling LDPS at 306-982-4466.

Animals at Large

We try to maintain an animal pound within the Lakeland area, especially during the summer and peak visiting season. Should we find an animal at large it is our hope we can reunite the furry friend with their family as soon as possible. We know that sometimes our four-legged friends don't always listen and stay at home.



Should you learn your companion is missing we would encourage reporting it as soon as possible, even if we have not picked up your pet we will have your information on record if we find it afterward. This is a type of report that can be made on-line, by texting, or by phone to our enforcement line. Please ensure that your pet is taken care of and not let out to run at large or to make continuous loud noises. **If you are out for a walk, pick up after your pet.** Our [animal control bylaw](#) is specific to both cats and dogs.

COVID-19

We have seen an increase in inquiries on a variety of topics related to the current State of Emergency and Public Health Order in Saskatchewan. We will continue to be here to support the public in their quest for information, permissible activities, and reporting of suspected violations.

Please know that at the time this is sent, the following activities are still prohibited:

- Garage Sales.
- Use of designated beach's, parks, playground use.
- All municipal outside public washrooms in Lakeland are closed.
- Non essential travel in the Northern Administrative District
- Any gathering of more then 10 people.

Please continue to practice safe social interactions by washing your hands regularly with soap, and maintaining a physical distance from others of at least 2 meters. **If you're sick – stay home!** Cold, flu, and allergies may lead to sneezing or coughing. Avoid others and stay at your primary residence, and call 811 for further direction if required.
