25WY - BUHL FIRE UPDATE: JULY 17, 2025, 14:00 CST

McPHEE LAKE, SASKATCHEWAN, July 17, 2025 – Parks Canada and [Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency](#) are working collaboratively to manage the Buhl Wildfire to allow both organizations to have authority and responsibility for this incident while working together effectively to share resources and information while maintaining their individual authority.

The Buhl Fire, first identified on June 29, 2025, was caused by a lightning strike and has burned approximately 40,958 hectares— 8,113 hectares within park boundaries and 32,845 hectares on provincial Crown land. Current resources assigned to the incident include 95 personnel, 7 helicopters, and 14 pieces of heavy equipment.

The fire is currently located:

- 9 km from Ramsay Bay
- 12 km from Montreal Lake Cree Nation
- 31 km from Waskesiu
- 35 km from Elk Ridge
- 38 km from McPhee Lake

While there is no immediate threat to public safety, due to extreme fire hazard conditions, the situation could change quickly. The fire remains out of control and changes in weather and fire behaviour could put public safety at risk.

It is especially important to report all suspicious smoke or wildfires to Weyakwin Protection Base at (306)663-5620.

Plan of Action

SPSA has set 2 incident trigger points:

1. **Trigger Point 1 – MacLennon River Area** – **IF** the fire reaches the MacLennon River McPhee, Waskesiu, and Elk Ridge will be advised to prepare to leave on short notice. Pack essentials such as water, food, medications, identification, chargers, cash, and important documents. Include items for pets. Keep your vehicle fueled. Seasonal residents will be asked to leave voluntarily at this time.
2. **Trigger Point 2 – Crean River Area** – **IF** the fire reaches Crean River – McPhee, Waskesiu, and Elk Ridge will be advised to leave. When the evacuation Order is enacted, you will **NOT** be able to return to your property. Security will be present to allow people to leave but not return. Thank you for respecting this.

What Can I Do?

1. **Register for SaskAlert** - The main communication method for evacuations will be SaskAlert. SaskAlert is the Government of Saskatchewan's emergency public alerting program. This program sends alerts about emergencies in real-time so you can keep yourself, your family, and your property safe. 2. **Register on the SPSA Evacuation App** once McPhee is added to the app. Please go to <https://app.saskecs.ca> to register.
3. **Contact the District Office** to register if you are not at your property or leave. (306)982-2010.

There is a fire ban in effect for all of the District of Lakeland No. 521.

Weather Forecast

Outlook for Friday will be partly cloudy south. North and east-central SK: mostly cloudy with showers and risk of thundershowers. Elsewhere: sun/cloud mix.
