25WY - BUHL FIRE UPDATE: JULY 18, 2025, 12:00 CST

McPHEE LAKE, SASKATCHEWAN, July 18, 2025 – Parks Canada and <u>Saskatchewan</u>
Public Safety Agency are operating under a Unified Command structure, ensuring a coordinated and collaborative approach to managing the incident and aligning operational objectives, resource sharing, and public communication.

The Buhl Fire, first identified on June 29, 2025, was caused by a lightning strike and has burned approximately 42,615 hectares – 8,470 hectares within park boundaries and 34,146 hectares on provincial Crown land. Current resources assigned to the incident include 96 personnel, 8 helicopters, and 12 pieces of heavy equipment.

There was no significant growth towards communities on July 17. Maps will be updated when there are significant changes to the perimeter of the fire. The fire is currently located:

- 9 km from Ramsay Bay
- 12 km from Montreal Lake Cree Nation
- 31 km from Waskesiu
- 32 km from Bittern Lake
- 35 km from Elk Ridge
- 38 km from McPhee Lake

While there is no immediate threat to public safety, due to extreme fire hazard conditions, the situation could change quickly. The fire remains out of control and changes in weather and fire behaviour could put public safety at risk.

It is especially important to report all suspicious smoke or wildfires to Weyakwin Protection Base at (306)663-5620.

Plan of Action

SPSA has set 2 incident trigger points:

- 1. **Trigger Point 1 MacLennon River Area IF** the fire reaches the MacLennon River McPhee, Waskesiu, and Elk Ridge will be advised to prepare to leave on short notice. Pack essentials such as water, food, medications, identification, chargers, cash, and important documents. Include items for pets. Keep your vehicle fueled. Seasonal residents will be asked to leave voluntarily at this time.
- 2. **Trigger Point 2 Crean River Area IF** the fire reaches Crean River McPhee, Waskesiu, and Elk Ridge will be advised to leave. When the evacuation Order is

- Register for SaskAlert The main communication method for evacuations will be SaskAlert. SaskAlert is the Government of Saskatchewan's emergency public alerting program. This program sends alerts about emergencies in real-time so you can keep yourself, your family, and your property safe. There is a fire ban in effect for all of the District of Lakeland No. 521.
