Interjurisdictional ATV Committee Approves Funding Requests from Lakeland ATV Club for Trail Upgrades Supporting Safe and Sustainable ATV Use

Meeting Summary – October 24, 2025

At the October 24, 2025 joint meeting, representatives from the RM of Paddockwood, the District of Lakeland, the Village of Christopher Lake, and Great Blue Heron Provincial Park approved a series of funding requests to improve heavily used ATV and UTV trails throughout the region.

These projects focus on safety, environmental sustainability, and inter-community connectivity.

Approved Projects:

- 1. **Murray Point to Okema** \$4,000 approved to restore trail surfaces, improve drainage, and address erosion concerns.
- 2. **Okema to Sunnyside** \$9,968.40 approved for maintenance on this 6 km route connecting major residential and recreational areas.
- 3. **Tower, SWS, and Clarine Connecting Trails** \$6,900 approved to rehabilitate sections damaged by past wet conditions and windstorms.
- 4. **Poachers Trail (Okema to Anglin)** \$9,675.40 approved for a two-year restoration plan (2024–2025) to clear blowdowns and stabilize the 12 km corridor linking Emma, Christopher, Anglin Lakes and Paddockwood. This was a two year commitment throughout 2024 and 2025.

Each project features matching in-kind contributions from the ATV clubs and some from the Great Blue Heron Provincial Park, demonstrating strong community collaboration.

The current trail account balance stands at \$57,855.10, ensuring ongoing support for trail infrastructure. The club is working with the park to find a possible route from the north end of Poacher's Road to the trails near Clarine Lake.
